My dear Mrs. Schaufuss,

Your letter of January 18th reached us yesterday. I thank you for your congratulations and I have been happy and grateful that I must not disappoint the anticipation of a success of mine. As soon as we are able to inform you more definitely about the development here, we shall certainly be glad to do so. This first week of practice which passed by does naturally not permit any practical conclusion

Both Mrs. Meyer and I were surprised to hear that the balance of our destroyed goods is still kept at the Foreign Trade Zone. We thought that this matter had been settled long ago. Immediately after we received your letter, we wrote to Dr. Scheiberg of W. Heimann. He had promised us on the day of our departure from New York that he would take care of our not incurring new costs. Enclosed you will find a copy of this letter. At present, we hope that the rotten matter will be burned at the earliest possible time and that no further expenses must be paid.

Assuming that you are well Mrs. Meyer and I send you our kindest regards.
